## **Educational Issues**

As the next Tennessee congressional meeting approaches, it is important that we research the issues facing our teachers and students so that we are informed and prepared for the legislative actions that may be taken in 2023. Here are some of the current topics being discussed on the Hill in Nashville:

## Fall 2022

- Governor Lee's focus on funneling money to voucher projects, in lieu of fully funding public schools.
- Fair salaries for teachers, counselors, nurses, and school staff.
- Reduction of requirements for teaching employment. How low should we go?
- Promoting common sense laws on gun control that will help prevent gun violence in Tennessee schools.
- Encouraging meaningful mental health support for students from counselors and social workers.
- Insuring that all children are reading at grade level by the end of third grade and strengthening basic mathematics for all grades.

### **Member News**

At the Fall Celebration we recognized nine members for their years of service with DKG. Two of them are mother and daughter. Judy Martin was inducted in 1981 and has earned a 40-year pin, while her daughter Alison Bryan has earned a 20-year pin for her service since being inducted in 2000.
